

# ATTENDANCE CHALLENGE

### Helpful Hints for Top Attendance

- Unless they are too ill to attend school, all pupils should be in school, on time every day.
- Whenever possible medical appointments should be made outside of school times. If a pupil has a medical appointment in school time you should provide the school with evidence. There is no need to stay off school all day for a medical appointment. If possible, your child should come into school at the start of the day to get an attendance mark for the morning session, and then return to school after their appointment.
- Pupils should not stay off school on their birthday.
- A leave of absence form must be completed for holidays. The school cannot authorise holidays in term time – such absences will be classified as unauthorised.
- Our Attendance officer is here to help. If you are struggling to get your child/ren to school on time, please contact school.



You can complete the questionnaire whilst you are in school and leave it with the teacher or can take it away to complete at home and return it to the school office.

# **Archibald Primary School - Key Information**

### How do we help keep children safe at the start and end of the school day?

Pupils in EYFS, KS1 and Y3 and Y4 are released by their teachers to known adults only. Staff work hard to ensure pupils are released to the correct adults and may need to check before releasing children. If an adult needs to collect more than one child from different parts of the school this is accommodated, and pupils stay with their teacher at the designated pick up point until they are collected. If parents/carers are delayed in collecting their children they are taken to the school office to be cared for until the parent/carer arrives.

We have staff monitorring gates at the start and of the school day. They ensure that pupils do not leave without their parents or carers and that puils and adults have left the site before the gates are locked. Older pupils who have written signed permission from home are able to walk home on their own. These pupils are escorted to the gate and dismissed by staff who ensure that they have left the school site safely.

We encourage pupils to stay with their adults at the start and end of the school day. Pupils and parents/carers who bring bikes and scooters onto the school site are expeted to push them whilst on the school site.

### How do we make sure pupils are well behaved?

We expect all pupils to follow our Five Golden Rules.

Pupils are rewarded for doing so and receive praise for making the right choices throughout the day. Each year group has developed its own rewards for pupils making correct choices. This icludes use of happy and smiley faces, stickers, class dojos etc.

Pupils are taught about the zones of regulation and how their actions and negative behaviours may impact on others. They are provided with strategies to help them when they need to.

All pupils are expeted to make the right choices. Where negative behaviours are demonstrated there are consequencs in place which are shared with pupils. Parents and carers are kept informed in these instances and are expected to help ensure pupils are well behaved through supporting school policies. Where required pupils may be issued with Behaviour Plans which are discussed with parents and carers. Some pupils may receive additional support form our pastoral team or from outside agencies. These are always discussed with parents and carers.

# How does the school ensure parents and carers are informed of what pupils will learn during the year?

There is an extensive part of our school website which details the curriculum followed by pupils in EYFS, KS1 and KS2. In addition, parents and carers are invited into school for triangulation meetings in the Autumn Term and the Spring Term. These are meetings where parents/carers, pupils and teachers can discuss what the children will be learning, the different ways in which they will be learning and how they can support at home. Sometimes these are personalised to the individual needs of the children.

Class teachers use SeeSaw to share learning outcomes and celebrate good work with parents and carers. Throughout the year parents and carers are invited into school to information sessions and curriculum workshops to work alongside their children on specific projects.

### How does the school inform parents/carers how well their child is progressing in school?

Class teachers are always willing to answer parents/carers questions about how their children are progressing in school. The start and end of school are very busy times and teachers generally have meetings after school so an appointment may may be needed for longer or detailed discussions. In addition, parents and carers are invited into school for triangulation meetings in the Autumn Term and the Spring Term where data on pupil attainment is shared and explained and Send Support Plans are shared and explained for pupils who have them. In the Summer Term a Pupil Progress Report is provided which details data, celebrates progress and indicates next steps.

Each week a PE Star Student is chosen and receives a certificate from the PE teacher. Our Stars of the Week are celebrated in key stage assemblies on a Friday morning and given a certificate to take home to share their success with their families.

Where a teacher has concern about a pupil's academic progress or behaviour, they may request a telephone call or a face to face meeting with the pupil's parent or carer to discuss their concerns and agree strategies to move forward. Our aim is to always work in partnership with parents and carers so that pupils can make the most progress possible.



# ELECTRIC SCOOTER (E-SCOOTERS)



# WHAT ARE E-SCOOTERS?

- •E-Scooters are classed as "Powered transporters". This term covers a variety of personal transport devices which are powered by a **Motor**.
- You can legally buy an e-scooter but cannot ride it on a public road, cycle lane or pavement.

### DID YOU KNOW?

•E-Scooters are illegal for use in any public space unless rented as part of a government trial
•Riding an e-scooter on the road is against the law as per the Road Traffic Act of 1988 and the Highway Act of 1835 •E-scooters are prohibited from being used on cycle tracks, cycle lanes or other spaces dedicated to pedal cycle use.
•Privately owned e-scooter can only be ridden on private land.



Alongside the Section 59 of the Police Reform Act legislation, Cleveland Police have introduced a policy to tackle the nuisance of e-scooters which follows a three-strike system.

- You will be taken home with the scooter and recorded on the police systems
- 2. You will be referred to attend a course and have the scooter seized.
- You will be prosecuted with road related offences and sent to court.

### WHAT OFFENCES WILL I BE PROSECUTED FOR?

A person using a powered transporter on a public road or other prohibited space is in breach of the law and will be prosecuted. There are a range of offences that you will be reported for. These will include, driving without a licence, insurance, due care as well as offences relating to harm caused to a person (causing serious injury or death through careless or dangerous driving).

Those who use powered transporters under the influence of drink or drugs can lead to imprisonment.

Offences relating to the standard of driving and speeding also apply.

# ARE E-SCOOTERS SAFE TO RIDE ON PUBLIC ROADS?

- E-scooters can be very dangerous and are not designed for use on public roads
- They have no suspension meaning even a minor defect in the road could cause the rider to fall off the scooter.
- E-scooter consist of a thin piece of metal between two small tyres with the user being inches from the road surface. This can result in a significant risk of traumatic injury on the road
- E-scooters are not designed to carry more than one person
- E-scooters are small, quiet and quick, meaning they present safety challenges when being ridden on busy public roads
- E-scooters can be dangerous when used in parks or on public footpaths as they can cause significant risk of injury to pedestrians

#### E-SCOOTER TRIALS

There are no government e-scooter trials in Cleveland. All e-scooters being used are illegal and will be dealt with accordingly.
