

For this year's Anti-Bullying Week theme, Power for Good, we focus on the importance of using power responsibly.

The definition of bullying involves a power imbalance, where one person uses their power to control or harm another.

Throughout Anti-bullying week, pupils will engage in a range of assemblies and activities to help them to understand that where they may have power and/or influence, they have a choice and a responsibility to use that positively, encouraging kindness, support, and standing up for others.

Pupils will learn that power needs to be used carefully. Power should never be used to dominate, control, coerce or manipulate others.

By equipping pupils with the skills to recognise power dynamics and encourage respect for each other's rights, we aim to foster and grow an environment where everyone feels that they belong, are safe and valued

# **CYCLE SAFETY**



It is great that we have so many pupils coming to school on cycles and scooters.

# CLASS 18 VISIT TO HEUGH BATTERY

Class 18 visited Heugh Battery Museum in Hartlepool recently.



The Heugh Battery Museum preserves the only First World War battlefield in the UK and commemorates the bombardment of Hartlepool in December 1914.

Volunteers spoke about how the bombardment affected the people of Hartlepool, they took the children into a replica trench and showed them the weapons and uniform soldiers used in WW1.





# **Y3 SCIENCE**

In their science lessons. Y3 pupils we have been discussing body parts and bones. They drew around children in each class and used their used outline to add photos of X-rays in the correct place.





# Y4 SCIENCE





Our Y4 scientists investigated pitch. They used elastic bands and geo-boards to investigate if the longest or shortest length of each shape made the highest pitched sound when plucked.

They were surprised as most of them thought all of the lengths would make the same sound.
